Oliver Turcotte, 5 Anne-Sophie Turcotte, 3

February 2009

A 36-year-old doctor from Quebec's Laurentians was charged with first-degree murder in the deaths of his two children The police discovered the bodies of Oliver and his sister Anne-Sophie Turcotte on Saturday, February 21, in a house their father was renting. (National Post, 2009)

Jessica Neilson, 25

March 2009

Jessica disappeared on Dec. 8 and her body was found March 27. Boyfriend has history of domestic violence and was acquitted was May 29, 2008, after he agreed to a court order to keep the peace for a year. As part of the agreement, he was ordered to continue taking anger management courses and was required to make an appointment at a domestic violence clinic within 10 days of signing the agreement. Jinane Ghannoum, 38

March 2009

"Jinane Ghannoum is dead. Her estranged husband, Mahboub El Hage, killed her in the family home despite a court order that he stay away. Then he killed himself. This tragedy is a failure, a horrible and fatal one, for the Quebec justice system." (The Gazette Friday, March 27)

Natalie Novak, 20 UPDATE! May 2006

The former boyfriend of a 20-year-old Ryerson student was convicted of second-degree murder this week in her 2006 stabbing murder. The Novak family is outraged and in a statement called on Premier Dalton McGunity to do more to protect victims of domestic violence. (National Post, 2009)

IN FOCUS

Dispelling the Myths

As part of the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project, women in Duluth, Minnesota, who had been abused by their male partners, developed a Power and Control Wheel, which has resonated with the experience of battered women worldwide.

The Wheel establishes a visual representation of an abusive relationship and is based on methods an abuser will typically use to maintain control over the victim. Characteristically, physical and/or sexual violence may resort when the methods listed in the spokes of the wheel fail to ensure the

abuser's need for power and control over the victim. (Adapted from A Safe Place website, Alberta)

Last year, the Health Committee adapted the wheel during the Health Cares About

Woman Abuse Campaign and distributed it to over 30 health care facilities in the Toronto area. Each issue of "Our Voice" will feature one of the various forms of Power and Control indicated on the wheel with the goal of expanding on the information already part of the wheel and more importantly dispel the myths associated with them

Myth: Domestic Violence is usually a one time isolated occurrence.

Fact: Battering is a pattern of coercion and control that one person exerts over another. Battering is not just one physical attack. It includes the repeated use of a number of tactics, including intimidation, threats, economic deprivation, isolation and psychological and sexual abuse

Partner Abuse Response Program

The PAR committee is on the verge of embarking on its 09/10 fiscal year. This is a very exciting time for the committee as we have many items on our agenda. This year committee plans to continue strengthening relationships with other community steak holders by working in partnership. In doing this, PAR programs can be offered from various locations throughout the GTA in an effort to make the programs accessible to communities in need. Additionally, PAR agencies will work together to create a curriculum for existing ethno-specific PAR agencies to focus of female offenders. This initiative steams from a need to better serve women who have come into conflict with the law. When the curriculum is in place, women will then have the ability to access cultural and linguistic specific services.
