

Best Practice Guidelines Amendment- Diversity

- 1. Determinants such as needs and functions of relationships, living arrangements, family constellations, and communities need to be considered in centering safety.
- 2. Be flexible: recognize that current models don't work for everyone and be willing to maneuver.
- 3. Diversity: accessible, sensitive, inclusive
- 4. Interventions need to include social location (race, class, gender, age, sexual orientation, ability, religious affiliation, history with colonization etc.) while emphasizing accountability and responsibility.
- 5. Development and promotion of progressive strategies outside of the formal child welfare and justice systems
- 6. Continued community education and education of service providers regarding domestic violence
- 7. Recognize community impact on women's decision to leave
- 8. Increased support for persons who have been abused with less than full or no immigration status
- 9. Collaboration with everyone: partner, survivors, men, communities etc
- 10. Contextuality: understand the different levels within which we each live. Effective services will acknowledge these issues.
- 11. Thinking outside of dominant assumptions
- 12. Mobilize strength and resources of communities while doing capacity building and promoting reciprocity
- 13. Response must identify and address location and intersectional of institutional power
- 14. Response must identify and address social location
- 15. Assessment of risk with both women and men regarding lethality and severity
- 16. Involve those abusers and survivors
- 17. Recruit men into work
- 18. Recognize and maximize the woman's right to choice
- 19. Be responsive to community needs and community led strategies
